WAM had another busy and impactful year in 2022. We hosted our first inperson WAMCon since the start of the pandemic, launched our all-new WAM Academy training program, grew our enrollments and school partners in our Girls on the Mic program, supported three Local Sirens artist residencies, and delivered two amazing Local Sirens concerts.

We also placed an entire cohort of interns in jobs at Dolby and hosted a dazzling array of recording sessions in our studios - the only professional recording studios in the world specifically built and run by 100% women and gender-expansive staff.

WHO WE ARE

WAM's mission is to close the gender gap in audio industries through training, mentoring, and access to creative technology.



Girls on the Mic (GOTM) is WAM'S award-winning after-school training and mentoring program serving San Francisco and Oakland girls and gender-expansive youth, ages 11-18, from under-resourced communities with free music/audio production and creative technology training classes.



The WAM Internship Program is widely recognized in the audio and music production industries for the caliber of training, range of activities, overall experience, as well as job placement opportunities. In 2022, interns were able to job shadow, tour, and engage in training workshops with partners like Dolby, Meyer Sound, Another Planet Entertainment, and Club Fugazi.

ADULT EDUCATION







WAM's adult education classes provide a multitude of audio training courses, certification training, and hands-on experience for women and gender-expansive people at any stage in their career. WAM launched "WAM Academy" in 2022, providing a cohesive training series that helps students gain the skills they need to become professionals in the field.

WAMcon, WAM'S music production/recording technology conferences featuring award-winning female and gender-expansive audio professionals as instructors and speakers, were held virtually for Nashville in April and then returned to an in-person, two-day conference in Los Angeles in October. Notable speakers included: Gena Johnson, Simone Torres, Lisa Chamblee, Susan Rogers, Leslie Richter, Laura Veltz, Yang Tan, and Blush, among many other top talents in the industry.

COCAL SIRENS ARTIST RESIDENCIES

WAM'S unique recording studios are in the heart of the SOMA district of San Francisco and offer professional recording sessions for musicians, authors, podcasters, and more -- all while providing mentorship to WAM students who support each session. WAM has recorded everyone from Beyonce's Band the OG's to David Sedaris, Neko Case, Toro y Moi, Kronos Quartet, and Denise Perrier.

WAM artist residencies provide local BIPOC female and gender-expansive artists with free recording services and mentoring. Resident artists this year were Dizzy Jenkins, LiL MC, and Amihan.



LOCAL SIRENS



Local Sirens Concert Series is WAM's free performance series that features exceptional Bay Area women and gender-expansive musicians and performers. In addition to WAM's artist residents, performers in 2022 included Skip the Needle, Stoni, DJ Bitezise, and Nina Sol, tearing up the stage at 5M Park in SOMA and legendary bar El Rio in the Outer Mission.











2022 REVENUE
